01 UTILIZE RESOURCES

02 BECOME AN ACTIVE LEARNER

Our curriculum delivery might be different from your previous school experience. We designed our curriculum to help you become not only the best nursing student you can be, but also the most successful nurse you can be. Active learning means you won't be spoon-fed information that you will simply memorize and recite back on a test. You will be responsible for taking an active role in your education. Take notes, ask questions, practice in labs, and challenge yourself in clinicals. Outside of class, make flash cards, form study groups, and create study guides to reinforce your learning and prepare for exams. At HCN you will learn to understand and think, not just memorize.

03 COMMUNICATE

Communication is key. Students will be most successful when they are checking their messages daily, asking for help when needed, and following the appropriate communication channels. At Hondros College of Nursing, you are not a number, and you won't get lost in the crowd. We value direct, one-on-one communication. If you need something, just ask.

04 COLLABORATE WITH PEERS

Nursing school is challenging—it's meant to be. The people who will understand best what you are going through are your classmates. We often hear students say that their classmates become family. So, get to know one another. There may be ways you can help make nursing school easier through study groups, carpools, backup childcare, and offering general support and encouragement.

We understand that nursing school is an investment in your future — an investment of your time, energy, and money. As an HCN student, you are encouraged to develop a strong understanding of your student ledger, which explains your student billing account. Communicate your questions and concerns right away if there is something you don't understand.

You can find many student billing and financial aid resources on the Student Portal. All official communication regarding financial aid will be sent to your student e-mail address, so it is imperative that you read your messages regularly and reply to them in a timely manner. Please be aware that changes in your schedule can impact things such as financial aid and payment plans.

Many HCN students work while they are in school, and if you need to earn income, investigate ways you can earn while learning. For example, you may choose to participate in the Federal Work Study program, which offers part-time employment around your schedule. Or, you could work for one of our community partners, which could help reduce your tuition. Additionally, be sure to inquire with your employer about whether tuition reimbursement is available.

ABOUT FINANCIAL AID

Do I need to apply for financial aid every year?

Yes, you do need to apply for financial aid every year. The FAFSA application is available beginning October 1st of every year. It is best to use the Data Retrieval Tool to import your tax information. You can now fill out the FAFSA on your phone! Download the MyStudentAid app or visit fafsa.gov and the FAFSA form on the go. The federal code number for Hondros College of Nursing is **040743**.

Are there payment options at HCN?

At Hondros College of Nursing, we do not take a one-size-fits-all approach to your tuition payment options. We can provide a customized payment plan, institutional loan, or other payment method, based on your needs and qualifications. Please talk with your financial aid representative about the options available to you.

How does my financial aid work?

Financial aid funds are awarded by academic year, which equates to three quarters. Therefore, it is important for you to check your financial aid awards on the Student Portal prior to the start of each quarter to ensure that your financial aid awards have been added to your account. If your financial aid awards have not been added to your account on the Student Portal, please contact your campus' financial aid advisor immediately.
